

National Visa for Au-Pair Stay

[Section 19c (1) Residence Act/Section 12 Employment Ordinance]

General Information

Persons between the ages of 18 and 27 can be granted a visa to work as an Au-Pair for a period of at least six months and not longer than twelve months.

The aim of au-pair stays is to improve language skills and broaden horizons by getting to know the host country. Only one Au-Pair stay in Germany is possible.

×	×	Proof of German language skills at least level A1
		Competency in the German language means that the applicant has the ability to communicate in German on at least a basic level, i.e. holds a certificate of successful completion of a German language course level A1 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Certificates issued by an institution, which performs testing in accordance with the standards of the Association of Language Testers in Europe (ALTE), are accepted. These requirements are only met by the Goethe-Institute (www.goethe.de).
	X	Proof of adequate health insurance coverage
		Health insurance coverage is required at the time of entry into the Schengen area. Usually statutory health insurance coverage provided by the university or future employer only goes into effect when you take up residency and enter into employment/begin with your studies.
		If you enter before, an additional private (travel) health insurance in line with <u>EU standards</u> (covering the entire Schengen area, minimum coverage of 30,000 EUR) must be purchased for the duration of time until you begin your employment/your studies and are covered through the statutory health insurance. Please ensure that your travel health insurance does not exclude protection if a long term or permanent stay is planned.
